As part of Google's ongoing commitment to furthering Anita's vision, we are pleased to announce the 2007 Google Australia Anita Borg Scholarship. Scholarships will be awarded based on the strength of candidates' academic background and demonstrated leadership. A group of female undergraduate and postgraduate student finalists will be chosen from the applicant pool. The scholarship recipients, selected from the finalists, will each receive a \$5,000 AUD (or equivalent) scholarship for the 2008 academic year.

Candidates must:

- Be a female student enrolled in an undergraduate or postgraduate program in 2008 at a university in Australia or New Zealand
- Be studying Computer Science, Computer Engineering, Software Engineering or related technical fields
- Be enrolled in full-time study in 2008
- Be in their second or subsequent year of study at the time of application, if currently an undergraduate student
- Be on track for first class honours (for undergraduate students only) and be able to provide supporting documentation

- You will be asked to attach your resume, grade transcripts (unofficial copy is fine), answers to some short essay questions and two letters of recommendation
